Flowing Wells Unified Governing Board Vacancy

Tucson, AZ – Kristie Hammar has informed Pima County School Superintendent Dustin Williams of her resignation from the Flowing Wells Unified School District Governing Board.

“I would like to personally thank Ms. Hammar for her dedication and service towards education in the Flowing Wells community. I wish her much success in her next chapter. Our office will help expedite the governing board vacancy process going forward,” said Superintendent Williams.

As per ARS 15-302, “within thirty days after notification of a vacancy, the school district governing board **may** submit up to three names to the county school superintendent for consideration of an appointment to fill the vacancy. The county school superintendent is not required to appoint a governing board member from the list of names submitted by the governing board.”

Out of respect to the process, Pima County School Superintendent Dustin Williams will now review and consider any qualified candidate who is interested in filling the vacancy.

Qualified candidates who would like to be considered for the vacancy must submit an affidavit of qualification and candidate appointment questionnaire to the Pima County School Superintendent’s Office by Friday, July 11, at 5:00 pm. The application packet can be found at: <http://www.schools.pima.gov/elections>. The completed packet may be hand-delivered to our office at 200 N. Stone Ave. or emailed to matthew.stamp@pima.gov.

All applications will be thoroughly reviewed and considered by Superintendent Williams and his leadership team.

The appointment will begin on the date of appointment and will continue through December 31, 2026. This position will be on the November 2026 General Election Ballot as a four-year term.
